SASS Recognition Week

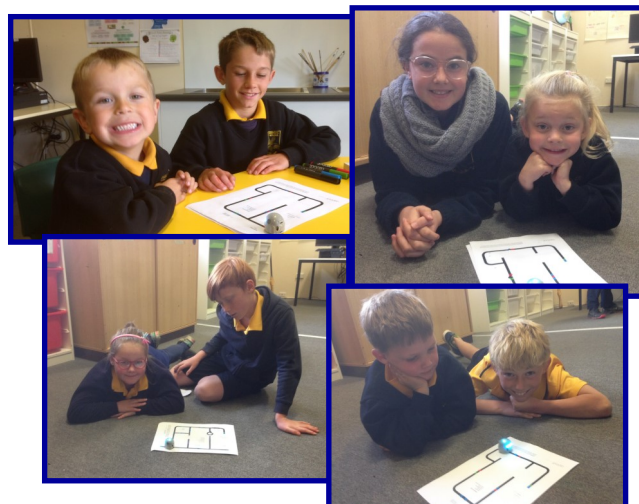
This week is SASS recognition week, where we thank all of our SAS staff who do an amazing job each day at SPS. This includes Shelly in the office, school learning support officers Brian and Samantha, Vicki in the library and general assistant Moggy, who tends our grounds and gardens. Without them, the school would not function as a whole and the work they do in both supporting our staff and students is incredible. Thank you everyone!

Technology Tuesday Sessions

Each Tuesday the two classes combine for a technology session that further enhances the students' knowledge and understanding of robotics and coding. Last week the students used 'ozobots' to complete a coding challenge that required them to get their robot from home to school safely, utilising only a few specific codes. This activity introduced the students to programming and computational thinking. More specifically the students learnt:

- *What kind of a robot is Ozobot?*
- *How does Ozobot sense its environment and move in it?*
- *How can you program Ozobot with colours?*
- *What do you have to pay attention to when using codes to program Ozobot?*

This week's lesson was based on using the Lego EV3 robots. The students are required to build the robot and then program it. Mr Vanek will be teaching the students these skills over the next few weeks.



School Improvements

Next Tuesday we will have some colourful creations and designs added to our school playground. Regional Linemarking from Wagga will add concrete games and learning objects that will not only be colourful but further add to our play and learning resources. The handball courts will be a great area for students who are looking for something different to do at recess and lunch. The snakes & ladders board will be used for numeracy strategies, particularly by the K-2 students. We will add to our promotional material over the next couple of weeks, specifically a new school flag, enrolment banner and sports flag. These items look fantastic and will enhance the school environment as well as promote the school in the wider community. A sneak peak is provided below.

New playground initiatives will be gradually introduced over the coming weeks. In collaboration with the students, staff and parents, we will look to add activities including craft, frisbee and vortex throwing, totem tennis, table tennis and kite flying. Some of these activities will take place on the school oval across the road, a greatly underutilised space. The K-2 students will also use the trikes from the playgroup room. Whilst we are continually looking for more activities to entertain and engage the students, they need make effective use of the school's facilities and play sensibly and respectfully at all times. At SPS, there are consequences for both

positive and negative behaviour choices, and these will be strictly adhered to at all times.

Premier's Challenges

Each day we participate in a range of physical activities as all students strive to achieve our target goals for the Premier's Sporting Challenge. These activities include skipping, running and circuits. Most children participate enthusiastically each day. All K-2 students and some 3-6 students have completed the Premier's Reading Challenge. There is still time for students to complete their reading logs next week in library lessons.

Arabin Cup

The Arabin Cup is fast approaching and will be held in Binalong on **Friday 20 September**. A note will be sent home when final details are received. Parental transport will be required on the day. The catering note, sent home with this newsletter, will need to be completed and returned to school by **Friday 6 September**.

P&C Donations

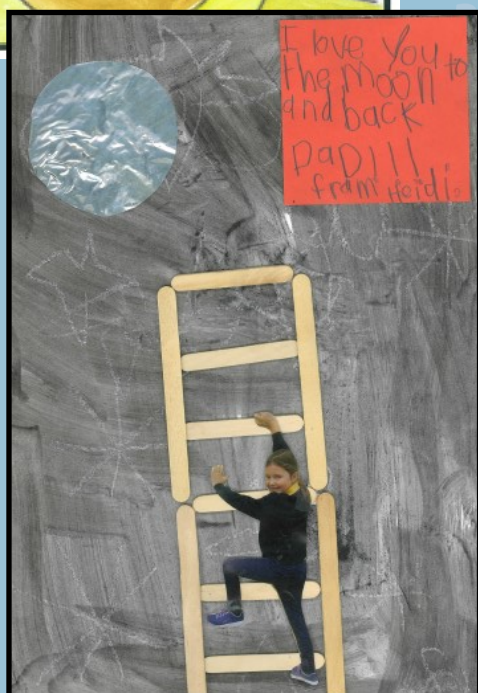

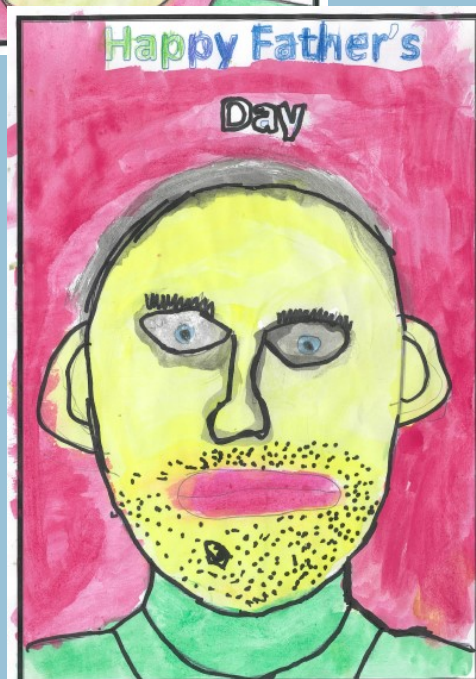
